
01 Consultants and Other Nonprofit Specialists

First screen, no searches or selections

1: space for an image, if desired.


2: colored areas indicate interactive zones in the PDF, and are not relevant to the design



02 Area of Expertise selected

Once the user has selected an Area of Expertise, the featured provider and resource are replaced with a list of results. All selections and search terms will be shown in the new "Current Search" section. Selecting additionals top-level Area of Expertise options will show all results in at least one of the selected categories.

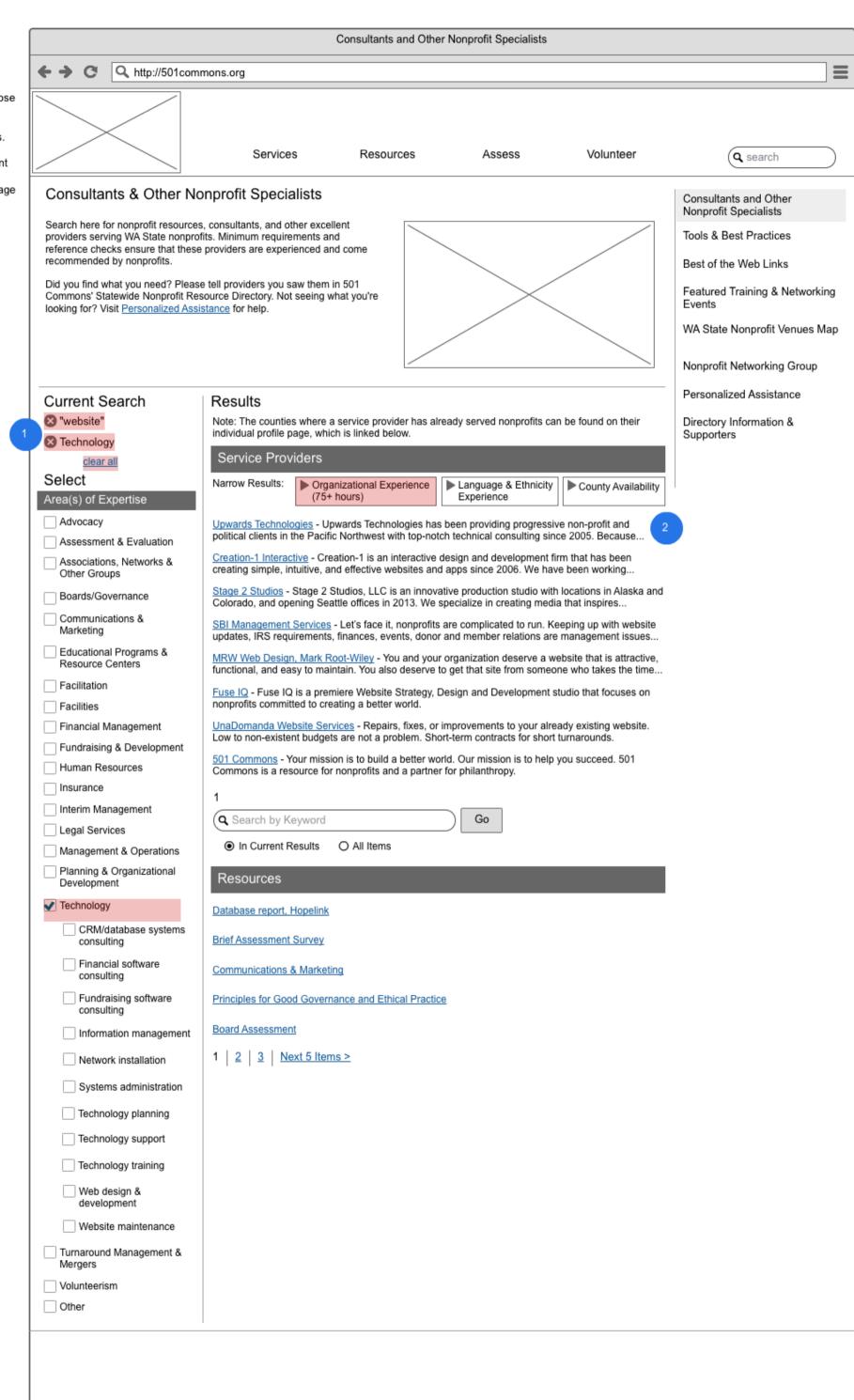
- Below the list of results, the keyword search becomes available.
- 2: If a selected Area of Expertise has subtopics, the list of subtopics becomes visible. Selecting the checked Area of Expertise topic again will also remove it from the search criteria.
- 3: Result text option 1: list up to two lines of subtopics of the selected Area of Expertise associated with that service provider. If results are listed with no Area of Expertise selected, list up to two lines of subtopics in all Areas of Expertise associated with the provider. Final content TBD.



03 Area of Expertise plus Search

Searching with the default "In Current Results" radio button selection will narrow the list of results to only those matching the keyword and all previous selections. Searching with "All Items" selected will start a new search, removing all previous topic and filter selections.

- 1: Selecting one of the search/filter terms under "current search" will remove it from the results criteria while keeping the others, selecting "clear all" will reset the page and show only the featured provider and resource.
- 2: Results text option 2: list up to two lines of the provider's "about" text. Final content TBD.

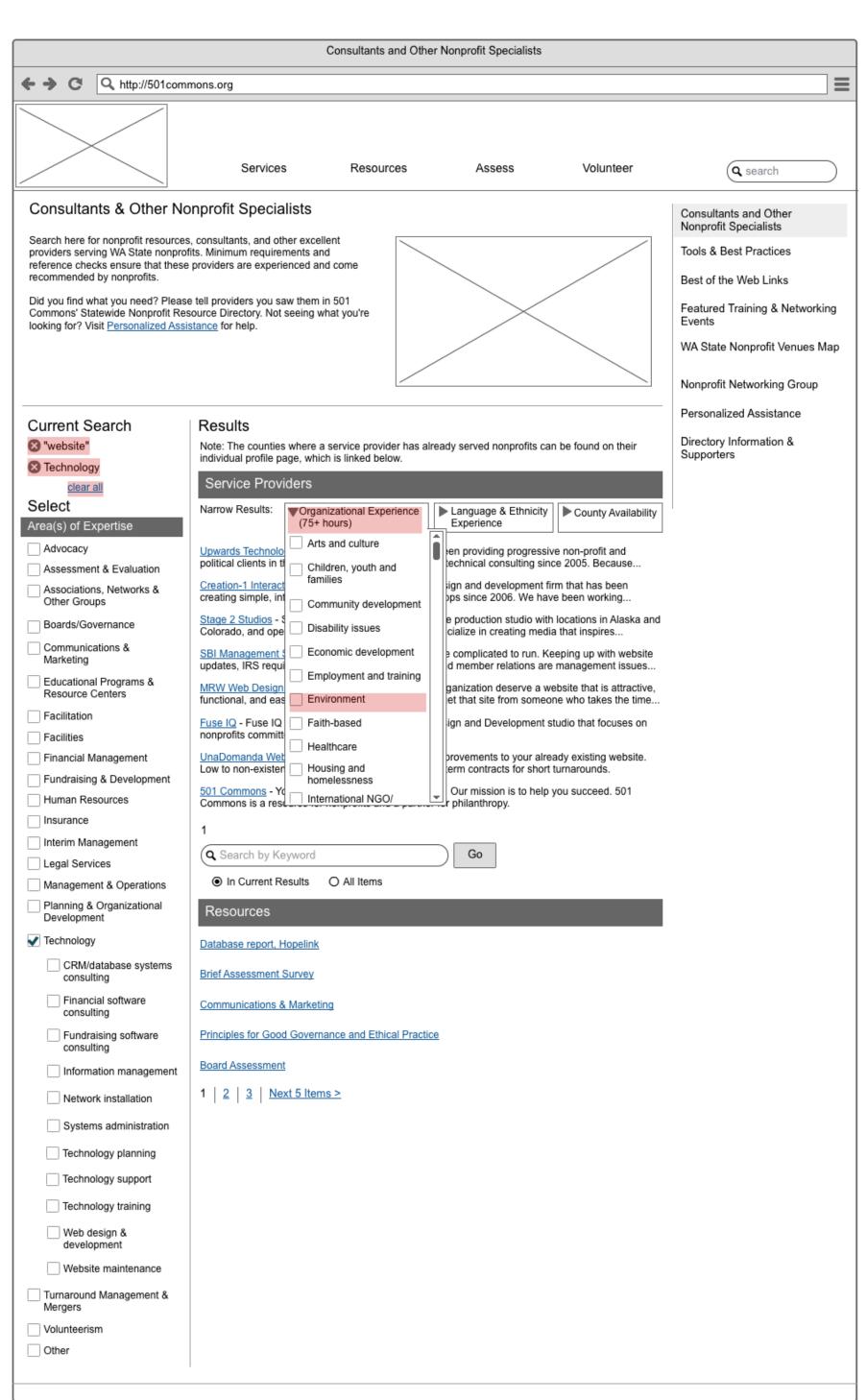


04 Narrow Results Dropdown Open

Clicking on one of the "narrow results" options opens a dropdown listing additional filter criteria. The dropdown is long enough to show 10 items, and the list of filters can be scrolled to see the full list. (see dropdown filters on Nordstrom.com for similar behavior)


Clicking anywhere on option text (not just in the checkbox) will select that filter option and close the dropdown. Multiple selections are possible (which will show the set of all results with at least one selection), but the dropdown must be opened again to add more options.

Clicking the dropdown title, or clicking anywhere outside the dropdown box, will close the dropdown without making a selection.




05 Search plus multiple selections

Within a filter category (Area of Expertise, Organizational Experience, etc), adding multiple selections expands the number of possible results. Across filter categories, adding multiple selections reduces the results to only results which fulfill both filtering selections. For example, each result must match both the Area of Expertise selections and the Organizational Experience selections, but it only needs to match at least one selection within each category.



06 Subtopic Selection

Within Areas of Expertise that have subtopics, selecting a subtopic replaces the higher-level topic with the more limited subtopic. Within the topic, multiple subtopics can be selected.



7 Search Term with no Selections

It is possible for the user to remove a selected Area of Expertise without removing a keyword search, or to search by keyword in "All Items" rather than within the current results, in which case the search results will show matches across all categories.
